TERMS	DEFINITIONS
1. <u>Arrival and Departing Facility Service</u>	Shall mean a charge assessed against a passenger departing or arriving through the Port facilities for the purpose of tourism. Terminating passengers are subject to compliance with all applicable Federal and Territorial Laws, Rules and Regulations.
2. <u>Authority</u>	Means the Port Authority of Guam.
3. <u>Board</u>	Means the Board of Directors of the Port Authority of Guam.
4. <u>Breakbulk Cargo</u>	Means cargo which is not classified as unitized or containerized.
5. <u>Bulk Scrap Metal</u>	Shall mean the loading of any salvaged "Bulk" scrap metal to clean up the island of Guam.
6. <u>Bunker</u>	The loading of fuel into a vessel's bunker for its own use. The meaning of the term is usually to the conveyance of the fuel over the ship's sides.
7. <u>Cargo</u>	Goods, wares, materials, merchandise or any other object that is or is to be transported.
8. <u>Containers</u>	Shall mean rigid, re-usable, dry cargo, insulated, refrigerated, flat rack, liquid tank or open top cargo container capable of being being readily mounted onto or dismounted from wheels, chassis or flat bed trailer. The container shall be 8 feet wide, 20 feet, 24 feet, 27 feet, 35 feet - 40 feet, or longer and 4 feet to 13 feet high, subject to restrictions of shoreside gantries. Except for dimensions, which are given above, it shall be constructed in conformity with the specifications for freight containers

	adopted by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) and the American Standardization Organization (ASO). The container will have top and bottom corner castings conforming to ISO/ASO specifications.
9. <u>Containerized Cargo</u>	Shall mean cargo in a container conforming to the above definition and is within the container. (See item 8)
10. <u>Container Chassis Operation</u>	That which requires the continued utilization of shipping agents/carriers chassis for the receiving/delivering of revenue loaded containers to/from vessel and/or to/from customer.
11. <u>Container Grounding Operation</u>	That which requires the utilization of Ports equipment (Rubber tired gantry crane and other related container handling equipment) for the receiving/delivering of revenue loaded containers to or from a grounding area.
12. <u>Container Overstow</u>	The single movement or single crane lift of a container from a vessel slot or cell to another position in stowage or from vessel stowage to deck or dock or from deck or dock to vessel stowage.
13. <u>Dock</u>	Any bulkhead structure, piling structure, pier, quay landing, or wharf to which a vessel may make fast to discharge or load cargo and/or passengers for any purposes.
14. <u>Dockage</u>	The charge assessed against a vessel for berthing or made fast to a wharf, dolphin or other structure; or lying alongside of or tied up to a vessel which is made fast to or is lying alongside of a wharf, dolphin or other structure; or, not tied up to or lying alongside of but using a wharf by means of boats, rafts, lighters, barges, or otherwise.

TERMS	DEFINITIONS
15. <u>Free Time</u>	The specified period of time during which cargo may occupy space assigned to it in the terminal area free of demurrage charges prior to loading or subsequent to the discharge of such cargo from or off the vessel.
16. <u>Handling Services</u>	Services rendered for the benefit of the cargo, during the period it is in the care and custody of the Port, when received at the place of rest assigned to the cargo by the Port, and from which cargo may be delivered to/from consignee/shipper trucks within the Port premises.
17. <u>Manager</u>	Means the General Manager of the Authority.
18. <u>Overstowage</u>	Means faulty loading, as when cargo for another port of discharge is stowed above, next to, or around cargo for Guam and therefore the latter cannot be discharged at Guam.
19. <u>Port</u>	Means Port Authority of Guam, located in the Territory of Guam located on Cabras Island, Apra Harbor.
20. <u>Port Facilities</u>	Means channels, basins, sea walls, docks, piers, land areas, utilities, warehouses, cargo handling machinery and equipment, and any other works, properties, structures or other facilities necessary for the development or operation of the Port of Guam.
21. <u>Preslung Cargo</u>	Shall mean cargo received and/or delivered as one unit at the Port premises in unbroken loads bearing one mark and consigned to one consignee such cargo(s) shall be in 2 ton preslung bags and/or in 2 ton preslung bundles. The slings must remain with the cargo for issue, otherwise the breakbulk rate will be charged.

22. <u>Revenue Ton</u>	<p>Shall mean the revenue ton used by the carrier according to the vessel's manifest to assess the carrier's freight charges. Based on the following as appropriate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) MBM (thousand board measurement) - 1,000 board feet.b) LONG TON - two thousand two hundred forty (2,240) pounds.c) MEASUREMENT TON - a ton of forty (40) cubic feet.d) METERED TON - two hundred forty (240) U.S. gallonse) METRIC TON - two thousand two hundred four and six tenth (2,204.6) lbs. weight, or 35.314 cubic feet.f) SHORT TON - two thousand (2,000) lbs. weight. <p>When the basis of the freight charges is not shown on the manifest, port charges shall be assessed on the basis of weight or measurement, whichever will yield the greater revenue.</p>
23. <u>Roll On Roll Off Vessels</u>	<p>Shall mean vessels with adjustable ramps. Ro/Ro shall be defined as the discharge or loading of cargo without Port equipment.</p>
24. <u>Stevedoring Services</u>	<p>Services rendered by the Port in removing or handling cargo from the end of the vessel's tackle or place of rest on pier to the vessel's hold, dock, between decks and deep tanks or to any spaces in the vessel; from any space in the vessel, remove and handle cargo, including on deck, between decks, holds, and deep tanks, and place said cargo at rest on the pier.</p>
25. <u>Throughput</u>	<p>A charge assessed for the movement of cargo from vessel storage to point of issue from the Port facilities or such other container storage facilities as authorized by the port General Manager, and return of the empty container from point of receipt to vessel storage or, in the case of export cargo, from the point of receipt at the Port to vessel storage.</p>

26. <u>Transshipment Rate</u>	Shall mean a charge assessed against cargo(s) received from a vessel for the purpose of passing or conveyed through Guam.
27. <u>Unitized Cargo</u>	Shall mean cargo received and/or delivered as one unit at the Port premises in unbroken unitized loads bearing one mark consigned to one Consignee. Such cargo must be securely strapped or fastened together on pallets or skids or shipped in a manufactured re-usable cargo van, vanpac, or cargo van, vanpac, or other synonymous term for van, with the exception of containers. Any single unit load which is otherwise unsuitable for forklift handling will not be considered as unitized cargo.
28. <u>Vehicle</u>	Shall mean any device for carrying passengers, goods or equipment, usually one moving on wheels, i.e., passenger cars, sedans, station wagons, pick-up trucks to 3/4 ton capacity, ambulances, hearses or panel trucks to 3/4 ton capacity.
29. <u>Vessels</u>	Shall mean steamboats, motorboats, sailing vessels, motor vessels, barges, lighters, liners, pleasure craft or any structure(s) made to float on the water for navigation.
30. <u>Wharf</u>	See Dock.
31. <u>Wharfage</u>	A charge assessed against all cargo passing or conveyed over, onto or under any wharves or between vessels (to or from barge, lighter, or water) when berthed at a wharf or moored in any slip, channel, basin, or canal or made fast to another vessel which is made fast to a wharf or moored in any slip, channel, basin or canal. Wharfage is solely the charge for the use of the wharf, slip, channel, basin, and canal, and does not include charges for any other activity or service.

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

PURPOSE: To provide clarification for payment of charges

GUIDELINES:

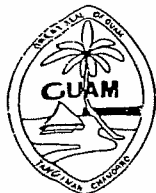
1. All invoices are billed within thirty (30) days and are due and payable thirty (30) days after the invoice date. Any invoice remaining unpaid thirty (30) days after the invoice date will be considered delinquent. All delinquent invoices will be assessed an interest charge at the rate of two (2) percent per month for as long as the invoice remains delinquent. Failure to pay within this time limit may also cause the suspension of credit privilege and may cause the responsible party to be placed on a delinquent list. Once placed on a delinquent list for reasons stated herein, the party will be denied further use of the facilities until all such charges have been paid except in cases where a bona fide dispute is in arbitration. Continued failure to comply with the terms set forth herein may result in legal action and the carrier/agent shall be responsible for all legal costs and attorney's fees.
2. Any dispute regarding invoices or charges on any invoice must be received in writing by the Port Authority within thirty (30) days of the invoice date. This dispute will be considered ripe for consideration only after the undisputed portion of the invoice is paid in full. No dispute will be considered until the undisputed portion of the invoice is paid in full.

3. If a dispute is timely received and is ripe for consideration (i.e. the undisputed portion of the invoice is paid in full), no interest will be assessed on the disputed amount from the date of the invoice until the Port Authority either responds in writing or the time within which the Port Authority may respond expires.
4. The Port Authority will endeavor to respond to timely-filed disputes which are ripe for consideration (i.e. the undisputed portion of the invoice is paid in full) within sixty (60) days of the dispute becoming ripe for consideration. Interest will begin to accrue on all disputes on the day of denial or deemed denial.
5. A party dissatisfied with the denial or deemed denial by the Port Authority of a dispute must demand arbitration (pursuant to the arbitration clause Board Policy Memorandum 2002-09) within thirty (30) days of the denial or deemed denial. Once a demand for arbitration is received in writing by the Port Authority, interest on the charge(s) originally disputed will only be assessed from the date of the denial or deemed denial by the Port Authority to the date of the demand for arbitration. Each party shall bear their own costs and attorney's fees incurred in arbitrating disputes over invoices.
6. The Port Authority reserves the right to apply any payment received against the oldest outstanding invoices.
7. The minimum charge for billing of services performed by the Port Authority of Guam in connection with rates and charges in this tariff shall be \$25.00

PURPOSE: To adopt an arbitration clause in order to settle disputes and controversies.

GUIDELINES:

All disputes and controversies of any kind and nature arising out of or relating to this tariff shall be determined by final binding arbitration. Any interested party may demand such arbitration in writing within thirty (30) days after the controversy arises which demand shall include the name of the arbitrator appointed by the party demanding arbitration, together with a statement of the matter in dispute or controversy.

Within twenty (20) days after such demand, the other party shall file an answer to the demand and name its arbitrator. Within thirty (30) days after the filing of the answer, the two arbitrators so selected shall name a third arbitrator. Within sixty (60) days after the third arbitrator has been named, the three arbitrators shall hold an arbitration hearing. Within thirty (30) days after conclusion of the arbitration hearing, the arbitrators shall render a final decision and/or award.

The individual arbitration costs and expenses of each party shall be borne by that party; however, the fees and costs of the three arbitrators shall be borne and shared equally by both parties.

The laws and rules of evidence of Guam (Title 6, Guam Code Annotated) shall govern the presentation of evidence at the arbitration hearing.

Any decision or award rendered by a majority of the arbitrators shall be final and binding on all parties to the proceeding, and judgment on such award may be entered and confirmed by either party in the Superior Court of Guam pursuant to 7 G.C.A Section 42107.

I. **REFERENCE:** Port Terminal Tariff, Item 3.(d) reads as follows:

"The Port reserves the right to withhold delivery of cargo until all accrued terminal charges against such cargo have been paid. For the purpose of enforcing the payment of charges, named in this tariff, on cargo handled over or stored on the Port Authority of Guam facilities, the Board may take possession of such cargo and may remove and store the same at the risk and expense of the owner or consignee thereof or may sell the goods at public auction or pursue such other remedies as may be provided by law."

II. **PURPOSE:** To establish procedures for reporting and disposing of cargoes, unclaimed or abandoned, in the Port Authority of Guam facilities over 60 days.

III. **DISCUSSION:** It is necessary to establish procedures for the following reason:

- A. To ensure proper control and accountability of cargoes, unclaimed and abandoned, in the custody of the Port Authority of Guam.

- B. To standardize methods of reporting, handling and disposing of unclaimed and abandoned cargoes.

IV. DEFINITION:

- A. **Cargo** shall mean containerized or breakbulk merchandise shipped through the Port. This merchandise is considered under the custody of the Port until issued to the consignee.

V. RESPONSIBILITIES:

- A. The **Terminal Division** shall be responsible for submitting an inventory list to the Claims Officer on cargoes not issued to consignees on the last workday of the month.
- B. Upon receipt of the inventory list, the **Claims Officer** shall obtain the following documents from:
 - 1. Terminal Division – a monthly cargo tracking report
 - 2. Entry Unit of Finance Division – vessel storage tracking sheet
- C. On the 60th day of storage, the **Claims Officer** shall prepare a letter for the General Manager's signature to the agent notifying them of cargoes not issued. The contents of the letter should include that the agent must make arrangements with the Port Authority Finance Division on the 30th day of receipt on payment of storage charges accrued. The letter shall be sent "certified-mail".
- D. If a response is not received, the **Claims Officer** shall submit a memorandum for the General Manager's approval to begin the disposal process. Attached to this memorandum shall be a list of cargoes unclaimed or abandoned. The documents shall be submitted to the General Manager no later than five working days after the 30th day deadline.

- E. Upon the General Manager's approval to begin the disposal process, the **Claims Officer** shall submit to Guam Customs & Quarantine Agency the list of unclaimed or abandoned cargoes and coordinate an inspection of said cargoes. Arrangements shall also be made to have the cargoes appraised and if possible, pictures of the cargoes should be taken on its condition.
- F. Within 5 workdays after the inspection, the **Claims Officer** shall prepare a list of the cargoes, its appraisal value and condition and submit it to the General Manager. The **General Manager** shall forward such list and provide options of disposal to the **Board of Directors**. The **Board of Directors** shall opt to sell the goods at public auction or donate the goods to a non-profit organization—depending on the appraised value of the cargoes. The proceeds of the sale shall apply to any outstanding amounts due to the Port including the administrative costs associated with the sale.
- G. Upon approval by the Board of Directors, the **Claims Officer** shall make arrangements with the **Procurement/Supply Division** to advertise in print media a notice of auction of the unclaimed or abandoned cargoes and recruiting an auctioneer.

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

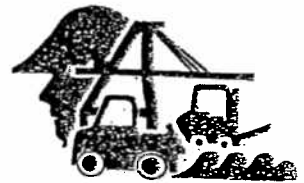
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

PURPOSE: To provide clarification and guidelines.

GUIDELINES:

1. To qualify for the Chassis Rate, Carriers and/or Agents must be in compliance with the following:

Proof of current Guam Registration and Safety Inspection for all operational bare chassis. All safety inspection documents shall be provided to the Port Authority OF Guam Tariff Section listed in alpha/numerical order by chassis number. Registration and Safety Inspection documents must be made available for inspection by Port Authority personnel from time to time but at least annually. All chassis must be clearly marked on all four sides by agent name.

2. Chassis Rate: \$185.00
Grounded Rate: \$255.00

- 3.(a) Discharge Operations:

The Port Authority of Guam will assess the Chassis Rate for the number of operational bare chassis available for the discharge portion only. The number of operational bare chassis shall be established by the chassis count. The operational bare chassis will be differentiated on a per size basis.

The Port Authority of Guam will prioritize the use of chassis during vessel operations to ensure that transshipment containers is left on chassis to ensure an efficient loading operation on the vessel or connecting carrier.

The following example is provided to ensure understanding:

Assumptions: Chassis count completed with the following results

- a) Fifty (50) 20 ft. chassis / Fifty (50) 40 ft. chassis / Fifty (50) 45 ft. chassis
- b) Vessel arrives with 300 containers to be discharged in the following size categories:

<u>Number/Type of Containers</u>	<u>Number of Containers Assessed Chassis Rate</u>	<u>Number of Containers Assessed Grounded Rate</u>
100 Twenty foot containers	50	50
100 Forty foot containers	50	50
100 Forty Five foot container	<u>50</u>	<u>50</u>
Total	<u>150</u>	<u>150</u>

As illustrated, the Port Authority of Guam will assess the Chassis rate for 150 containers and assess the Grounded rate for 150 containers, in addition to all other charges, such as, wharfage and applicable special handling.

3.(b) **Backload Operations**

The Port Authority will assess the Chassis rate for full export container on wheels. Grounded full export and all empty containers will be assessed the Grounded rate. The applicable charge for transshipment containers will have been assessed to the first carrier.

4. Bare Chassis and Empty Container Count

Carrier, agent, or designated representative will schedule the bare chassis and empty container count with the Operations Manager or his designee prior to vessel arrival. Counts will only be scheduled and conducted during normal business hours. The bare chassis count will only be conducted within the Terminal Container Yard. Any adjustable bare chassis or combo chassis will be counted against the fixed size during the count. Chassis with empty container waiting to be off loaded will be included during the count. Bare chassis found to be non-operational during the count will not be counted. Bare chassis found non-operational during vessel operation will be subtracted from the original count prior to billing submission.

The total empty containers available will be verified through the Terminal computer tracking system during the count. Empty containers for issue for stuffing or for transshipment loading should be identified at the time of verification. The agent will have to provide a copy of the Delivery Order for issuance with the Port Entry Stamp affixed to the document and a copy of the Permit to load for transshipments. Only then will these containers be subtracted from the count.

The agent will be provided a receipt for the amount of bare chassis and empty containers counted for their record.

In the event the agent or representative fails to schedule or show up at the scheduled time for the count, the Port Authority will conduct the count and no disputes will be entertained.

Under the Hook

Under the Hook must be requested in writing from the Port Authority by the Agent representative at least five (5) working days prior to the arrival of the vessel, together with a copy of the Bill of Lading and an original Customs & Quarantine pass stamp.

No rate exists for pulling an empty container from the empties pile for subsequent re-issue for stuffing. Therefore, a new flat rate will be set at \$25 for container(s) on chassis and \$50 for container(s) on ground for re-issue of empties to cover Port labor and equipment cost.

When a specific container number is requested for re-issue, it will be accomplished via the "Special Service Request". The cost for labor and equipment will be charged as specified in the Port Terminal Tariff.



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

7. Exported Local or Transshipment cargo in storage will be billed to the vessel said cargo was loaded.

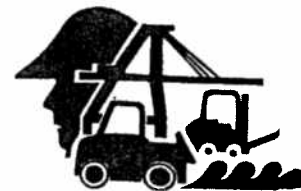

The rate will be as follows:

- (d) A fee of \$25 must accompany each claim filed against the Port for any loss or damage to freight or merchandise. Where the Port is liable for loss or damage to freight or merchandise, subject fee will be refunded.
- (e) A fee of \$5 shall be charged for each weight tag for the use of the Port scale.
- (f) Rates for lease or rental of any port facility or portion thereof, shall be established and published by the Port Authority Board of Directors, exclusive of the Terminal Tariff, in accordance with provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act. Any such lease or rental agreements in effect at the date of adoption of this tariff by the Board of Directors shall be continued in effect at existing rates until expiration of such agreements, unless otherwise provided in the subject agreements.



FACILITY MAINTENANCE FEE POLICY AND GUIDELINES

Purpose:

The Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port (PAG) must refurbish and modernize its facilities. This is necessary to better serve its customers and prepare for substantial expansion of the Port's cargo handling terminal that is needed to handle the anticipated increase in cargo volumes resulting from the Guam Military Buildup. On January 29, 2010, the Guam Public Utilities Commission (PUC) approved the Port's interim tariff rates request. In doing so, one component of the approved interim tariff rates was to implement a facility maintenance fee of \$25.00 per container and \$1.35 per revenue ton for breakbulk subject to the establishment and implementation of a policy. This policy is to implement the \$25.00 facility maintenance fee per container and \$1.35 per revenue ton for breakbulk cargoes to provide funding for the maintenance, replacements, and repair of the port facilities.

Definition:

The "facility maintenance fee" is the fee assessed for use of port facilities to provide funding for the maintenance, replacement and repair of the port facilities. The fee will be assessed to port users utilizing the facilities in the receipt and delivery of cargo to and from vessel and/or in connection with the receipt, delivery, checking, care, custody and control of cargo as required in the transfer of cargo.

The foregoing does not include any services or facilities charge that is included in wharfage, dockage, wharf demurrage, wharf storage or any other individual charges. This fee does not include the handling of cargo, loading nor unloading operations, or any labor other than that which is essential to performing the service.

Facility Maintenance Fee

Facility Maintenance Fee	\$25.00	per Full Inbound, Outbound, and Inbound Transshipment Container
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\$ 1.35 *per revenue ton for Breakbulk

*Exemption = Bills of lading for Breakbulk cargo will be exempted from the facility maintenance fee when the cargo is valued less than \$2,500.

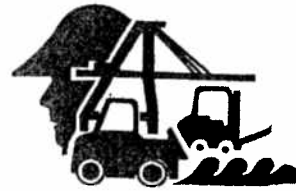
Guidelines:

1. Vessels, their owners, charterers and agents assigned the use of Port facilities in accordance with Section I of the Port Terminal Tariff shall be liable for and shall collect and pay to Port the Facility Maintenance Fee as provided for in this memorandum and the provisions of Item 3, section I of the Port Terminal Tariff shall apply.
2. The Port will bill the facility maintenance fee based on the total number of Full Inbound, Outbound, and Inbound Transshipment Containers on the Master Container Outturn (MCO).
3. Facility Maintenance Fee will be billed to the first carrier for all Inbound Transshipment containers.
4. Vessels, their owners, charterers and agents who are entitled to the Breakbulk bill of lading exemption are required to submit to the Finance division a copy of the cargo invoice for each bill of lading claimed to be below the threshold by vessel and within thirty (30) days of the invoice date. PAG will validate whether the cargo value is within the threshold amount.
5. PAG Finance Division will issue a credit to any vessels, their owners, charterer and agents who are determined to be, on case by case basis, exempt from the facility maintenance fee.
6. When the basis of the freight charges for breakbulk is not shown on the manifest, Port charges shall be assessed on the basis of weight or measurement, whichever will yield the greater revenue.



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

I. DISCUSSION:

The Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port consumed about 185,000 gallons of fuel for FY-2008 to handle cargo within its terminal facilities. The current rate for diesel is \$3.39 per gallon. Since the policy revision on August 20, 2008 the fuel rate decreased by 35%.

Due to the recent decreases of fuel cost the Port will be implementing the following fuel surcharge rates. These rates will be adjusted on a quarterly basis to reflect current fuel prices.

II. FUEL SURCHARGE RATE:



I. DISCUSSION:

The Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port is acutely aware of the potential threat to its facilities and the movement of cargo posed by terrorists. The impact of a disruption or a slow down in the flow of cargo as a result of terrorist action would, in all likelihood, severely affect the businesses and citizens of Guam and its neighboring islands.

The Maritime Security Fees will assist the Port in defraying the expense of the administration and maintenance of security systems and certain capital and operating expenses incurred by the Port to comply with 33 CFR, Chapter I, Subchapter H, Part 105 – Maritime Security Facilities.

II. PROVISIONS:

The provisions of the Maritime Security Fees are as follows:

A. Applicability and Payment of Security Fees:

The fees and charges contained in this memorandum shall be applicable to all vessels that call at the Port, and which have provided a notification of arrival in accordance with Section I, which are required to pay dockage fees. The fees and charges contained in this memorandum shall also be applicable to all cargo transiting in and out of the Port and for passengers embarking or disembarking at the Port. Failure by the responsible party to pay the charges assessed in this memorandum may, in the sole judgment of the Port, be grounds for denial of a berth in the future.

B. Security Fees:

1. Vessel Security Fee:

- (a) Vessels assessed dockage charges in accordance with Section VIII shall be subject to an additional charge equal to 5% (five percent).
- (b) Vessels assessed a wharfage, labor charge out, equipment rental, port entry fee and dockage shall be subject to a vessel security charge equal to 5% (five percent) of the total invoiced amount in accordance with Sections II, IV, V, VII and VIII of the Port Terminal Tariff.

2. Cargo Security Fee:

- (a) In addition to the vessel security fee, a Cargo Security Fee based on the following schedule shall be assessed on all cargo as provided and as described in Sections II and III of the Port Terminal Tariff:

3. Passenger Security Fee:

- (a) Passengers carried for compensation by vessels, e.g. crew members, originating outside Port of Guam shall be assessed in addition to the Arrival and Departing Facility Service Charge of \$1.00.
- (b) The charge shall be assessed on passengers on one way or round trip voyages or on passengers in transit.

C. Collection of Fees:

Vessels, their owners, charterers and agents assigned the use of Port facilities in accordance with Section I of the Port Terminal Tariff shall be liable for and shall collect and pay to Port the Security Fees as provided for in this memorandum and the provisions of Item 3, Section I of the Port Terminal Tariff shall apply.

III. EFFECTIVE DATE: The Maritime Security Rates will go into effect January 29, 2007.

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



Guidelines:

1. Tenants and customers that need to do any form of welding, cutting, grinding, chipping, or any spark-producing operations inside the Port's area of responsibility must apply for a Hot Work Permit at the Safety Office on a daily basis.
2. Customers/Agents that maintain credit with the Port will be billed for Hot Work Permit. If customer/agent is not an Approved Charge Customer/Agent, customer must pay the permit fee at PAG cashier. Cashier will stamp permit request form and provide customer with a receipt.
3. To ensure that all hot work conducted in the facility complies with the requirements of 33 CFR 126.30 section Port Safety Inspectors will conduct inspections on all "Hot Work Permit" issued.
4. Port Safety Inspectors or U.S. Coast Guard personnel may conduct random inspections for compliance and fire prevention.
5. Any violation of the conditions of the hot work permit may result in work stoppage, suspension of the permit and/or civil penalty.



PURPOSE: To establish a special rate for Power Consumption for Pre-Trip Reefer Container.

POWER SURCHARGE RATE

Special Rate for Power Consumption of
Pre-Trip Reefer Container

\$ 49.00 Daily

Guidelines:

1. Power Surcharge Daily Rate applies for a 24-hour period, or fraction thereof, commencing with 0800 of one day to 0800 of the following day and includes Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.
2. The above special rate includes power usage and electrician monitoring the temperature of the reefer container.
3. The \$49.00 daily rate is in addition to the equipment and labor currently charged for pre-trip containers.
4. Customer or Agent must request for special service at PAG SSR Center. SSR employee will enter information into the system and coordinate with electrician and operations to perform the service at the time requested.
5. If customer/agent is not an Approved Credit Customer/Agent, customer must pay the estimated charges of the service request at PAG cashier. Cashier will stamp SSR form paid and provide a receipt for customer.

RENTAL OF PORTABLE LIGHTS

RATE:

\$100.00 – One time charge for set up

\$500.00/ day

\$2.539/gallon- plus dollar amount for fuel used

GUIDELINES:

To rent out the Ports Portable Lights, Carriers and/or Agents must comply with the following:

1. Carriers and/or Agents must complete a request form through the Ports Special Service Center.
2. Carriers and/or Agents must adhere to the Special Service Request Guidelines, Memorandum GMFA03-006A.
3. Customer will take the SSR copy to Equipment Maintenance Section in order to make the necessary arrangements.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

EQMR will ensure that lights are set up, fueled, and functional at the specified time requested.


EQMR will ensure that lights are secured after each use. They will complete the operational log and have customer acknowledge and sign log and then submit signed log to the Billing Section. If rental exceeds one day, PAG personnel will have the log acknowledge daily and submit to billing once service is completed.

EQMR personnel are responsible to respond if any problem arises. Customer will not be allowed to operate the portable lights.

*Fuel charge is subject to change with current rates.

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

Penalty for Violation of Regulations).

Sections responsible for performing the service should submit the service request forms along with the operations log to the SSR Center on the following working day.


The Special Service Request Center hours of operations are 0800 – 1600 hours Monday through Friday, this is necessary in order for Port personnel to perform administrative functions. In order for supervisors to plan Port employees' work schedule, any work that needs to be performed during vessel operations should be submitted twenty (20) hours in advance.

Requests for water and reefer unplugs should be submitted two (2) hours in advance prior to requested date and time.

The Port Authority will charge a penalty fee of \$200.00 for agents who fail to follow SSR procedures. (Reference PAG Terminal Tariff, Section I. General Rules and Regulations, Item No. 2. Penalty for Violation of Regulations)

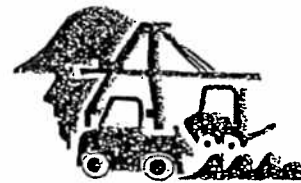

For services to be performed on Saturday, Sunday or Monday, notice must be given no later than 15:00 hours on the previous Friday. (Reference PAG Terminal Tariff, Section I. General Rules and Regulations, Item No. 5. Requests and Availability of Port Services and Facilities, (a))
