Chronology Horizon Lines Exit

- Oct. 25, 2011- Termination of FSX Services announced by Horizon Lines
- Nov. 10, 2011 Final sailing to Guam
- Nov. 21, 2011 Final Port Call to Guam

Contributing Factors

- Over 37% drop in east bound freight over past 12 months
- 40% increase in bunker fuel charges since launch of FSX
- Delays in expected infrastructure-driven cargo growth (i.e. Military Buildup) in Guam a contributing factor.

Revenues

- Financial Consequences
 - Normal Transactions Specific to Horizon Lines
 - Potential Rental Revenue Loss: \$84,000
 - Potential Misc. Operational Income: \$125,000
